
CREATING CONNECTIONS

This fall, Mount Mercy welcomed a new member to our administration, Mrs. Lina Smith, our Assistant Head of School. In this role, Lina wears many hats and provides support to both students and faculty and staff. She can often be found running around the building, dealing with the many issues that arise during a busy school day. One of Lina's many roles includes student discipline and enforcing our Student Handbook, a tough job when trying to create a united and friendly school atmosphere. But Lina is changing the approach of the relationship between students and administration.

Lina was born and grew up in Colombia, South America. In November, she took over our theology classes to share her journey in the U.S., how she's come to feel a sense of belonging here, and what it means to have rights and responsibilities as a citizen. Mrs. Smith and the students connected this idea to our school community and recognized that, as citizens of Mercy, we also have rights and responsibilities within our school.

Together, the entire school created a rights and responsibilities chart, so now everyone has a clear understanding of what is acceptable and what is not. Mrs. Smith also shared that part of her role is to ensure that everyone's rights are respected. She talked about the new approach on discipline that is called Growth Oriented Justice and students had the opportunity to give feedback on the ideas for consequences.


At the end, Mrs. Smith introduced a space that will be dedicated to discussing students rights and responsibilities. All the students brainstormed ideas to name the space. It is called Magic Meets! In this space, students will be able to share what they feel isn't going well and suggest things they would like to change or improve. 

A True Agent of Change



At Mount Mercy Academy, leadership, service, and academic excellence are more than just values—they are lived out each day by students like Nola Marrero, a rising senior who continues to embody the spirit of Mercy in everything she does. Recently elected as Student Body President, Nola's journey through high school has been nothing short of extraordinary.

This summer, Nola was selected to attend the "Agents of Change" Leadership Camp hosted by the National Federation for Just Communities of WNY (NFJC). This overnight experience brings together high school leaders from across the region to foster community building, explore justice and inclusion, and develop the tools needed to be positive changemakers in today's world.

In addition, Nola earned admission to the highly competitive National History Academy Summer Program—an intensive, immersive experience with only 90 students selected nationwide. Her acceptance into this prestigious program is a testament to her academic excellence and passion for civic engagement. Nola was also selected for a fully funded week long program at USC. The Youth Leadership Institute (YLI) by the Hispanic Scholarship Fund (HSF) at USC is a prestigious, week-long summer program designed to empower high-achieving Latino high school juniors with the tools, confidence, and resources to become future leaders.

This fall, Nola will also be recognized with one of the region's highest honors for youth leadership: the Father Baker Youth Service Award. Each year, this award is presented to a young individual who has demonstrated a deep commitment to community service and advocacy. Nola will be honored at the Victory Nite Awards Dinner in September for her dedication and compassion in helping others.

When she's not leading her class or advocating for others, Nola is actively involved in Mercy's athletics and student life. She's played varsity soccer for three years, captains both the soccer and flag football teams, and has also participated in lacrosse and track. In addition to her athletic involvement, she's part of over a dozen clubs and academies, ranging from Campus Ministry and Mock Trial to Model UN and the Leadership Academy. She also serves in leadership roles across several of them, including Junior Editor-in-Chief of the Merciette, Debate Captain, and Vice President of the Student Government.

Nola credits her extracurricular involvement with helping her find her passions, build time management skills, and form lasting friendships. Her favorite class? Business Law, taught by Mr. McCrea, which aligns perfectly with her career goal: becoming an Assistant U.S. Attorney. Her plan is to attend the University at Buffalo's 3+3 Law Program, major in psychology and minor in political science, and ultimately work on the southern U.S. border.

Beyond academics, Nola is deeply rooted in service. One of her most meaningful projects was organizing a pajama drive for FANA, an orphanage in Colombia where her cousin once lived. With the help of the Mercy community, she collected over 100 pairs of pajamas, ensuring that every child received not just one, but two.

When asked what advice she'd give to a young girl choosing a high school, Nola says: "Follow your heart. Shadow and explore. Find the place where you can be most authentically you." For her, that place was Mercy.

As she heads into her senior year, Nola is most excited for the memories she'll create with her classmates and the opportunity to lead her school with heart, humility, and purpose. Mercy is proud to shine a spotlight on Nola Marrero—an unstoppable force for good and a true agent of change.







Project Based Learning at Mercy

At Mount Mercy Academy, our Project Based Learning curriculum sets us apart. Project-based learning fosters innovation by engaging students in hands-on experiences that develop critical problem-solving skills. By working on real-world challenges, learners actively participate in their education, making connections between concepts and practical applications. This approach not only deepens understanding but also sparks creativity and collaboration, preparing students for diverse career paths. Through meaningful projects, students gain the confidence and skills needed for future success in an ever-evolving world. We are so proud to have the capability to offer these opportunities to our students.





The Mount Mercy Science and Healthcare Academy participated in the Brain Boot Camp at The Jacobs Institute, a not-for-profit vascular medical technology innovation center. The students were minds-on as they learned about vascular disease, discussed models used for treatment options and collaborated as they worked through the innovation process.





Our 10th grade Health classes, along with teachers Mrs. Natalie Keller and Mrs. Kelly Tomlinson, went to Impact Fitness Systems (IFS) in Hamburg work with their trainers. Students learned a lot about movement, kinesiology, and working their muscles and body. They had a great time!

Empowering student success through community collaboration and partnerships



As part of our ongoing partnership with the SPCA Serving Erie County, representatives came to talk to and educate our freshmen biology classes. The students learned about the history of the SPCA, what the organization does and all of the services they provide, as well as about volunteer and internship opportunities. They were able to ask questions, play a fun game and meet Henry, the educational pet ferret! In another visit, students learned a lesson after conducting endothermic and ectothermic temperature experiments using Dubia cockroaches. Students also had the opportunity to meet a bearded dragon. This was a great way for our students to be introduced to the SPCA and all of the opportunities available to them through our partnership and our Academy of Science and Healthcare.

Outside of the classroom, our students went to the SPCA for the Vet Medicine Intensive program. This was an amazing experience where the girls learned the job duties of vet assistants, vet techs and veterinarians. They practiced terminology and dissecting techniques on gummy bears and participated in a vaccine and overpopulation simulation. Then the students even suited up to view a spay operation on a kitten! We are so thankful for our community partners and the opportunities they create for our students!

Project-based learning is a powerful approach that helps students discover their passions, guiding them toward future careers and college majors. By engaging in real-world projects, students gain a deeper understanding of concepts in a way that feels meaningful and relevant. This hands-on method makes learning more exciting and dynamic, transforming the classroom into an interactive space where curiosity and creativity thrive. By applying knowledge to real challenges, students develop critical thinking skills and confidence, making learning both effective and inspiring.

Our students in the Business and Finance Academy are always hard at work designing and creating new Wizard Wear for their student owned and operated shop. The The Wizard Wear shop sells merchandise which is designed, created and made by the students, including crewnecks, quarter zips, tote bags, water bottles, jewelry and more!



Academy take their knowledge and experience out into the community. These Mercy girls go to various local grammar schools to teach 6th, 7th and 8th grade girls important lessons including gratitude, healthy habits, time management, positive self image and more. Our students help develop the lesson plans

Our Science and Healthcare Academy had an incredible opportunity to spend the day at Roswell. The girls were able to see the ATLAS Department Simulation Lab as well as the Nursing Professional Department and the Clinical Laboratory.

Our students experienced everything from laparoscopic skills to a simulator mannequin, taking blood pressure, touring the blood bank, the microbiology and pathology departments and more! What an amazing opportunity we had visiting Roswell, the leading hospital for cancer treatment and research.





Students in our Forensic Science class are working hard to use science to solve crime.

The mock crime scene was part of their final evaluation for their crime scene unit, which involved learning about crime scene evaluation and procedures. This includes tasks first responding officers have, how to secure and protect and the basics of processing a crime scene. Students used search patterns to evidence, took measurements and evidence for sketches, and took pictures of the scene and evidence. What an incredible hands on learning opportunity!






Freshmen Students in our Honors Living Environment class have been on a journey of seed to organism. Students started by studying tomato, basil, and mint plants.






