Mount Mercy Academy honored many students during its quarterly Honors Assembly. Awards were presented to scholars, scientists, athletes and artists.

First Honors were awarded to students who attained a third quarter overall average of 95 or above. Seventy-five students received honor cards from their class officers and moderators. Sixty-three students earned Second Honors for an average between 90 and 94.99. An additional 46 students attained Merit Roll status with averages between 85 and 89.99.
